Turn Right onto Bay Street > Turn Left onto Empire Grade >


Turn Right onto Heller Drive > Turn Left onto Porter-Kresge Road.



To minimize long lines, conference participants are expected to arrive promptly at their designated dining time. As numerous conferences share dining halls, participants are requested to dine within a <u>45-minute</u> time period.

- Vegetarian options will be available at each mealtime.
- Entry to the dining commons will require a meal card (adult groups), wristband (youth groups), commuter meal ticket, cash or credit card.
- Meal cards or wristbands will be issued at check-in. There is a \$35.00 replacement fee for a lost meal card or wristband. Damaged or worn wristbands can be exchanged at no charge at the assigned Conference Office. Meal cards must be surrendered at checkout to avoid a replacement charge.
- Meals begin with dinner on the first night of the conference and end with lunch on the final day.
- Please note UCSC is a smoke-free campus. There is no smoking areas on campus.

Please note that conferees of diverse programs and populations will utilize the same dining hall. We ask that respect and courtesy for such diversity be observed and that dining halls be a place to enjoy conversation as well as meals.
